

Studio -3 Release 3 - update note

Studio -3 Release 3 has a number of improvements over previous releases. Please use it instead of any previous release you currently have. You may update your existing -3 System Discs from this new -3 Issue Disc by simply following the instructions in the Music 3000 Installation Guide as if you were adding the -3 to a System Disc for the first time - the new data will simply replace the old. You do NOT need to delete any additional user files when using the Issue Disc to merely update a System Disc like this.

Most of the changes are concerning compatibility - the effect of the update is to avoid problems you might otherwise find in the future so you don't need to worry about the individual differences. For users that are particularly interested, they are listed below.

Hybrid would be grateful for news of any problems you may find, e.g. 'wayward' Music 5000-only programs that do not give precisely the same results on a Music 5000/Music 3000 system.

changes from Release 1

1 Continuous movement of Mixing Desk faders (with SHIFT-cursor key held down) is restored.

2 The equivalence of EVEN CHANS, ODD CHANS, n PAIR CHANS (sic) to EVERY CHANS is now restored, whereas they were previously ignored. Such erroneous use of CHANS (where CHAN was intended, in an instrument definition) is obviously not recommended, but never-the-less this change has been made for compatibility of -3 System Discs with existing user programs that include this mistake.

3 The Mixing Desk display now retains the screen location of voices which are discarded and re-assigned as a piece progresses, except where those screen locations have been reused for other voices assigned meanwhile.

(This is also the case on the Mixing Desk on the Studio 5000D and Studio 5000-4D discs).

4 All changes from release 2.

changes from Release 2

1 The Mixing Desk's preservation of effect of 'group' setting by number key presses is restored.

2 The non-contribution of the Mixing Desk to the number of 'instruction' modules installed (that being limited to a maximum of 9 by the '! Too many modules' message) is restored. This means that, as before, you can successfully load the KFX module (e.g. by loading Music 4000 example sounds) with the Mixing Desk present, without getting the '! Too many modules' error message.
